Ms. Brower plans to study business, finance, or real estate in college, preferring Ohio State or UC, and believes she is a strong team player due to her field observation skills, adaptability, and commitment to giving maximum effort in any position. - **Career Overview and Current Status:** Chloe Brower is currently attending Seton High School in Cincinnati and plays for the Tempest FC soccer club, primarily as a striker but also playing midfielder and defense forward. They have been playing soccer since they were five years old and have previously played for St. Dominican School as a defender and Cincinnati West soccer club as a midfielder. The purpose of the discussion is to capture their career story and highlights to share with college coaches.
- **Motivation and Passion for Soccer:** The individual expressed that they love soccer because it allows them to be themselves and dedicate 100% effort, which helps their problems "just go away". They added that soccer is where they thrive, and they never think they would get burned out from playing. Motivation for training and games comes from simply being with their team, warming up with them, and having great chemistry on the field.
- **Academic and Career Goals:** In college, Chloe intends to study business, finance, or real estate, with Ohio State or UC being preferred schools to stay close to home. They are looking to excel academically while playing college soccer, but if playing does not work out, they will focus on their academic pursuits to get a degree in their chosen field.
- **Team Contribution and Adaptability:** They believe they are a good team player due to their ability to observe and understand the field, visualizing where the ball needs to go. They excel at seeing passes that others cannot and can adapt to other positions by being told what to do and knowing the main points of that position. The individual stressed that they will give 100% effort in any position they are placed in.

- **Highlighting a Memorable Game Moment:** When asked about a great moment for coaches to know, Chloe described a game where their team was down 3-0 and an opposing player, number 24, was scoring all the goals. They recalled running back from the striker position to perform a slide tackle in the box to stop the player from scoring and save a goal, noting that they won nationals one year.
- **Interests and Activities Outside of Soccer:** Outside of soccer and school, Chloe works at their middle school as an after-school care teacher, helping children from preschool through 8th grade. They also enjoy reading and writing, specifically romance novels and horror stories, and submitted a piece for the Scholastic Awards for writing. They also have a talent for knowing different dog breeds and animal facts.
- **Adapting to New College Teams:** When asked about adapting to new teams and the pressure of playing with new people in college, Chloe expressed confidence that they will be fine. They noted that they generally "mesh with anyone" and will try to observe how new teammates play before giving their all to see how their playing style connects with the team.

- **Introduction and Soccer Background:** Sean Kurker began the interview with Khloe Brower from the Tempest FC soccer club in Cincinnati, who shared that they have been playing soccer since they were five, up through high school. Khloe stated they love the sport because it provides a positive team and positive coaches who uplift them, allowing them to play with their full heart and give 100% at every game.

- **Academic Aspirations:** Khloe intends to study business, real estate, or finance in college. Their interest in real estate stems from their father owning houses, and their interest in finance developed after taking engaging economics classes; they believe they would excel in a business career.
- **Qualities as a Team Player and Motivation:** Khloe considers themselves a good team player because they can observe situations on the field, read the field well, and ensure the ball reaches their teammates' feet. They stay motivated for training and games by being with their team and coaches, noting that the second they step onto the field, their focus is entirely on soccer.
- **College Experience Goals:** Khloe is seeking a college experience that allows them to play soccer while excelling academically in their chosen career. If their college plan changed and they could not play soccer, they would adjust by focusing entirely on the academic part to graduate and get a diploma.
- **Positional Excellence and Adaptability:** Khloe explained that their speed and physical contact help them excel at the striking/forward position, asserting they are a physical player who will run through opponents to get to the goal. They adapt to playing other positions like midfield and defense by being told precisely what to do and how to do it, guaranteeing 100% effort if given clear instructions.
- **Memorable Moments and Successes:** A great moment Khloe highlighted was when they played striker but came all the way back to perform a clean slide tackle on an opposing striker who was threatening their goal, preventing a score. Outside of soccer, Khloe's biggest success was winning the national championship for soccer.
- **Interests Outside of Soccer:** Outside of school and sports, Khloe works at their middle school with students from preschool to 8th grade. They also enjoy singing, acting, and writing books in their free time.
- **Closing Message to Coaches:** In closing, Khloe wants coaches to know they are a very physical player who enjoys physical contact and being worked hard on the field. They require truthful criticism to identify and fix issues, and they thrive in a good positive team environment.
